Dear Parents and Community Members,

This annual report card issued by the Oregon Department of Education offers a comprehensive picture of how Evergreen students performed on the 2016-17 state tests. It also reviews what programs and supports are offered at Evergreen School. Please note: The Oregon Department of Education has temporarily suspended the assignment of school ratings during the transition from the OAKS (Oregon Assessment of Knowledge and Skills) to the new college and career readiness assessments (Smarter Balanced). Evergreen School will not receive an overall school rating on this report, but will receive a new overall school rating on the 2017-18 report.

In the 2016-17 school year, Evergreen School students again outperformed the state as a whole in both English/Language Arts (ELA) and Math at every grade level tested, 3-8. Our students continue to

exhibit results in terms of academic performance in the top portion of all Oregon schools. We are VERY pleased with the Evergreen results.

We have every expectation that Evergreen School students will continue, as a whole, to demonstrate academic excellence and growth. We will continue to focus on implementing the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) at all grade levels. Our goal is to maintain our ranking in the top levels of all Oregon schools.

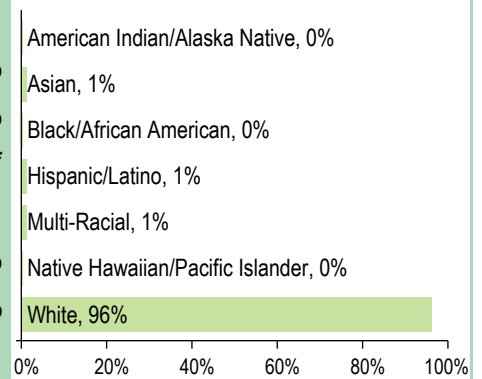
