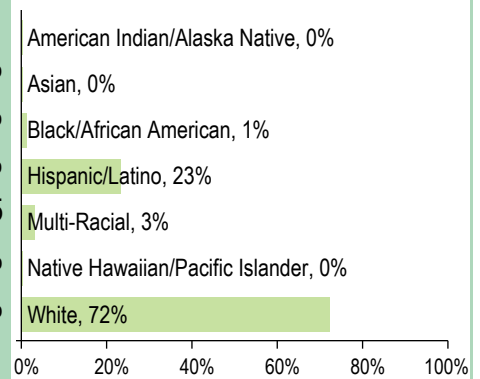

English Language Arts (Administered statewide in grades: 3-8, 11)

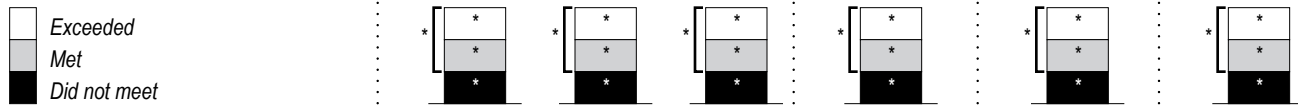


Mathematics (Administered statewide in grades: 3-8, 11)
